





Our Commitment to the Environment | Vermont Campus

Food scraps at our Vermont office are composted locally

Composting was implemented in 2009, six years before it was required by state law.

73 kW roof solar array produces 40,000 kWh of energy per year

A solar array on an average residential roof is 6 kW.

20 solar thermal panels

A solar thermal system supplies more than 25 percent of the hot water used in our Montpelier headquarters.

Solar field

500 kW capacity solar field on the property produces 600,000 kW of energy per year.

In 2010, National Life added wood chip boilers to the heating system, avoiding 2,000 tons of carbon emissions per year.

- Our primary winter heating system is fueled by locally sourced wood chips, which saves 200,000 gallons of fuel oil and the associated 2,240 tons of carbon emissions per year. We run two wood chip boilers with 5 and 7 million btu (oil backup).
- The wood chip boilers are the primary source for space heating, using ~3,000 tons of wood chips.
- Our electrostatic ash precipitator, an advanced pollution control technology, reduces the particulate matter emissions from our biomass boilers to an amount equivalent to about 12 wood stoves.

Garden space

We loan over two acres of garden space to be used as a community garden for Montpelier residents.

Energy Leadership

National Life Group was a 2022 recipient of an Efficiency Vermont Energy Leadership Award, citing:

- ~\$60,000 in energy savings per year, attributed to the following activities:
- Transition to a direct digital control system for HVAC
- Partnership with Automated Logic and Efficiency Vermont to evaluate the savings potential of a chilled water optimizer
- Evaluation of existing hydronic heating system and rightsizing circulators for efficiency
- Early adoption of LEDs.



RECYCLING PROGRAM

- We divert a significant amount of our waste from the landfill. This includes food waste, paper, cardboard, aluminum, glass, batteries, and oil.
- Waste ash from the biomass boiler system goes to farms for fertilizer.
- We donate used office furniture to local community organizations to keep it out of the waste stream.
- We regularly donate refurbished computers to local community organizations.
